

The Utah Preservation Office has received for consideration a copy of the Folder No. 2 application. It appears, after review, that the revisions that our first letter indicated took place. Therefore, we would concur with the recommendations of eligibility and ineligibility of the sites and isolated finds recorded in the project area. If the five eligible sites are voided as presently stated in the mine plan, then we would concur with the determination of no adverse effect also.
