

The Utah State Historic Preservation Office received the above referenced report on January 28, 1991. The report states that five cultural resource sites were recorded within the project impact area; [42CB737-741]. We concur with your recommendation that one site recorded earlier; [42CB402] is Eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, and that the five sites recorded by this survey are Not Eligible. We also understand that 42CB402 will be avoided during work on the mine. We, therefore, also concur with your recommendation that there will be No Effect as a result of this project.


#### Technical Comments:

1. The use of sampling in an area with known historic structures may be questionable. Our office notes that a sampling level used to provide information about prehistoric and historic sites that are not readily visible is an accepted practice. However with standing structures; our office would recommend that Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Identification be followed for historic properties. Sample surveys are recommended in some cases for standing structures. However; each case should be considered separately. For this size and type of project, a survey of all of the 180 acres may have been appropriate.
2. The homestead that is mentioned west of 42CB741; is there any further information about the site? Would it provide any more information about sites in the area?

Our office has copies of Secretary of the Interior's Standards if there are any questions.
