This letter is a correction to the letter addressed to you dated February 18, 1992. We were informed by DOGM that the Hidden Valley Mine has been reclaimed and is no longer active. The letter should have named the Soldier Canyon Mine Site.

You have requested permission to place a mobile screening unit at the Soldier Canyon Mine Site. The reason for this is that the construction of new coal handling facilities (see Approval Order dated September 4, 1986) has been delayed indefinitely due to market conditions.

Under the Approval Order dated September 3, 1991, you may install a screening unit. Under the conditions of this Order, the screening unit will be subject to a 20% opacity limitation as measured by 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9. If you have any questions, please contact Donald E.
