No. 2, Carbon County, Utah

In anticipation of the expiration of the five-year permit term for the Centennial Project on January 4, 1987, please be advised that the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (DOGM) will require a minimum of 120 days to accomplish review of a mine plan renewal package. This means that a complete package must be received by DOGM by September 4, 1986 at the latest.

To initiate this process, DOGM is hereby requesting that Tower Resources submit a completely updated and consolidated Mining and Reclamation Plan (MRP) by March 1, 1986. All permit conditions, commitments, mine plan revisions and modifications made since the initial permit approval, including the Emergency Lease must be incorporated into the new MRP. The new MRP must be formatted such that all future submittals and updates can be fit directly into the document.
