Summary

The combustion loss data from the sediment pond waste has been reviewed. The material is less than 30% combustion; therefore, it is not considered a coal waste material. However, the material does contain substantial amounts of coal to warrant the material as being nonproductive for revegetation. The material should be used as fill material as previously outlined in the January 5, 1988 correspondence.

Recommendation

The applicant should proceed in addressing the pertinent requirements outlined in the December 23, 1987 deficiency letter prior to disposal of the waste.
