Dear Mr. Glasson:

We have reviewed plans and supporting documentation for construction of the referenced facility. The documents were received from the Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining on February 8, 1989.

The plans and supporting documentation, as submitted, comply with the *Utah Wastewater Disposal Regulations*. A construction permit, as constituted by this letter, is issued subject to the following conditions:

1. Any modifications to the approved plans and specifications must be reviewed and approved before construction.
2. Facilities constructed under this permit must not be placed in service until the Bureau of Water Pollution Control has completed a final inspection and has authorized you to do so.
3. Modification of the existing discharge permit to include this point source will be necessary.

Compliance with requirements of your discharge permit issued under the *National Pollution Discharge Elimination System* must be maintained during construction of the approved project.

The sediment pond is designed to contain runoff and sediment resulting from a 10-year, 24-hour storm event. The total pond volume is 2.33 acre-feet.

A set of approved plans is returned herewith bearing our construction permit stamp. These plans must be kept available for examination during inspections conducted by representatives of the Bureau of Water Pollution Control, and for resolution of and conflicts or discrepancies which may arise during construction. Please provide us an additional set of plans for our records.

Please advise us of the beginning of the construction. This will enable us to schedule periodic inspections and monitor construction.

Andalex Resources, Inc.
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If the approved project is not under construction within one year, resubmittal of the plans and specifications for reissuance of a construction permit will be necessary.
