

The attached letter was received today from Carbon County. I believe it answers the questions from your letter sufficiently and in fact some emphasis is added in appropriate areas, such as Andalex not having the ability to deny public access.

I would like to add some additional comments. Andalex has a written agreement with Carbon County in which article 3 states that the county has sole responsibility for any repair and maintenance of road 299. Also, aside from private housing, sportsmen, and other recreational users, there are numerous commercial users of the road, including the users of BLM grazing lands. A number of ranchers use this road for transportation and access including beyond the Centennial minesite. There are corrals located along both sides of the roads. Other commercial users in addition to Carbon County (Airport, Landfill) are Joy Manufacturing, the Animal Hospital, Superior Automotive, Henry Construction, Price Mine Service, Price River Water Improvement District, Mountain Fuel Company to maintain their natural gas line, Utah Power and Light to maintain numerous powerlines, and various drilling and seismic companies. Because of the road's close proximity to the metropolitan area it is traveled extensively, particularly on weekends. It is also patrolled by the Carbon County Sheriff's Department.

Re: County Airport and Deadman Creek road between old Highway 6 and the Centennial Mine, crossing portions of Sections 12, 13, 22, 23 and 24, Township 14 South, Range 11 East, and Sections 7, 18, 19, 30 and 31, Township 13 South, Range 11 East, SLBM.

In response to the letter from the Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining regarding whether the above road is a public road, we provide the following information:

1. The above road is a public road pursuant to the laws of Carbon County, Utah.

2. a. It is not possible to give the exact date that this road was designated a public road. In fact, I do not believe that this road has ever been other than a public road.

b. This road is included in the Carbon County road system.

c. The road is classified as a Class B road within the public road system, and Carbon County has numerous other Class B roads within its system.

3. Carbon County has expended the following amounts of public funds for maintenance of the road for the identified years:

a.	1990	\$ 5,057.00
b.	1989	\$ 1,000.00
c.	1988	\$84,975.00

4. These maintenance costs are very similar to other Class B roads in Carbon County. In some years the road requires a great deal of maintenance, and in other years, very little is required. The amount of public maintenance money spent also depends on the amount of money available, and the priority of the requirements for a particular road, all of which is determined year by year.

5. The construction standards for this road are similar to other roads of the same classification in Carbon County.

6. Andalex Resources, Inc. does not have the ability to deny public access to this road. The road is used by local residents, and members of the public for access to recreational areas, including sportsmen for hunting purposes, hikers and sightseers.

If other information is needed, Carbon County will be happy to provide the same.
