

Dear Mr Haddock,

Enclosed please find 3 additional copies of Andalex's proposed Incidental Boundary Change for your distribution (I have also forwarded one copy each to the Price and Salt Lake offices of the BLM as well as the SHPO).

Please take time to make sure other agencies are aware that this request is only for an extension of our existing 3rd West section underground workings onto the new AEP lease. The extent to which these entries proceed to the west will be a function of the economic mining limit of the Centennial Coal Seam. This request is for the Centennial Seam only and mining of this seam will not impact the Aberdeen seam 350 feet below. On the average, these underground workings will be under 800-1000 feet of cover. We are not proposing any surface disturbance whatsoever.

At this time, we have met extensively with the BLM and have their complete support for this activity. They are in full agreement that now is the time to recover this small pocket of coal. We have also toured the surface with the Division of Wildlife Resources. They had no concern about adverse impacts to wildlife, particularly raptors.

As you know, our time frame for this activity is one month away so please don't hesitate to call should questions arise.
