Dear Mr. Haddock:

Enclosed are 4 copies each of Andalex's modified MRP which now includes the recently acquired AEP Lease containing Centennial Seam Coal.

I have broken down the submittal into 5 basic ingredients:

1. The entire text has been modified as necessary to incorporate this new lease into the overall plan. It is not being submitted as a separate amendment.
2. All plates in Volume II which needed to show the addition of the new AEP Lease have been modified and now show information as needed such as new subsidence monitoring and new surface water monitoring.
3. A description of the "Probable Hydrologic Consequences" has been prepared and should be inserted into Appendix L. A spring and seep survey was conducted which did not turn up any surface or ground water in the vicinity of the new lease.
4. The federal coal lease assignment which gives Andalex the right to enter into and mine the Centennial Seam Coal on the AEP Lease. Should be inserted into Appendix J.
5. This cover letter will act as an official request for an incidental boundary change which involves the new AEP Lease. Please refer to Plate 41 of the MRP which depicts the mining sequence in the Centennial Seam. As can be seen, Andalex desires to cross onto the AEP Lease as an extension of existing underground mine workings in its active 3rd West mining district. This section will

be driven to the west as long as the Centennial Seam is economically minable, then retreat mining will commence. It is unknown at this time exactly how far to the west these entries may go. It is important to point out however, that this incidental change does not involve any surface activity whatsoever. Meetings have already been conducted with the Bureau of Land Management and they are in complete agreement that the time to mine the small piece of Centennial Coal is now. We anticipate that at the time Andalex needs to cross the boundary for the second time, the entire significant modification to the MRP will be approved.

Please advise us as to any additional information you need as this request is for an immediate need. We will respond to any needs of the Division's as quickly as possible.

We sincerely appreciate the Division's expeditious approval of this request.
