Hi Matt,

Andalex Resources Inc. has submitted an application to drill three additional gob vent holes 5B, 7A and 8A. 7A is on an existing pad location. Our review includes our findings of the previous survey, your correspondence, att. 0013.pdf and our review and findings of the current survey, att.200611201. Please advise if you concur with our findings for this project.

For the previous GOB hole project task # 2420, Senco-Phenix conducted a Class III survey for holes 5A, 7, 8, and 9. The results showed that there were no historic resources within the project area. The Division defined the "area of potential effect" as the proposed degas well sites and the 800-foot access road extension. The Division evaluated the survey information and made a finding of "no historic properties affected" for this project. Correspondence with SHPO for this project is attached as 0013.pdf. For the current GOB hole project, task # 2698, Senco-Phenix also conducted a Class III survey for holes 5B, 8A, five-acre buffers and an access corridor. The results showed that there were no historic resources within the project area. The Division defined the "area of potential effect" as the proposed degas well sites and the access corridor. The Division evaluated the survey information and made a finding of "no historic properties affected" for this project as well.
