Thanks Steve,

We actually did a bit of overkill on the seal, except for the native soil at top. They averaged between 2 and 3 feet. See below.

Jason,

We averaged :

15'-20' of hole plug on top of the rubber plug.

AMC 20 Grout / 20% solids within 50'-40' from surface.

10'-15' of hole plug on top of the grout.

Then topped it off with an average of 30' of neat cement.

Then cut the casing 2'-3' BGL.
