Dear Tom:

Per your request, I have reviewed the above referenced water rights, which at the present time, are in the ownership of Florence A. Sweet. As we have discussed, Mr. Roger Skaggs has proposed to lease the water rights from Mrs. Sweet for mining purposes at the Blue Blaze Mines. However, the rights are limited by flow and priority, therefore, the water under each right may not be available throughout each year. In addition, prior to utilizing water under these rights, a Change Application must be filed with this office to accurately describe the point of diversion and other pertinent water right information. The following is a brief description of each right:

91-353

Priority: Morse Decree 1st Class (1874)  
Flow: 0.015 cfs (approx. 7 gpm)  
Source: Unnamed Spring  
Located: S. 760 ft. & W. 725 ft. from NE Cor. Sec. 19, T13S, R8E, SLB&M  
Uses: Domestic & Industrial from May 1 to September 1

91-94

Priority: September 15, 1925  
Flow: 0.15 cfs (approx. 67 gpm)  
Source: Unnamed Spring  
Located: Same as water right 91-353  
Uses: Domestic & Industrial from September 1 to May 1

91-330

Priority: March 17, 1936  
Flow: 250 gpm (0.557 cfs)  
Source: Underground Water  
Located: S. 970 ft. & W. 1580 ft. from NE Cor. Sec. 18, T13S, R8E, SLB&M  
Uses: Mining

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As you can see by the priority date of each right, 91-94 and 91-330 would be subsequent to existing senior rights, and may not be fulfilled except during high water years or during winter months. Should mitigation become necessary, 91-353 would probably be the only right available which might be used to replace other area water rights.
