

The right to enter and mine are covered in the permit application of Blue Blaze Coal Co. submitted March 27, 1989 to the State of Utah, Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining. The total recoverable coal is a combination of both the Castlegate "A" Seam and the Hiawatha Seam are: 3,990,000 Tons. The present leases are the only means to access the federal reserves for future mining because of the old mined out areas around the permit (LMU) area. If they can't be mined through this area a total coal beds to the north, north east, and northwest will be lost.

3. Effective Control of a single operator:

All lands within the permit area are under the control of the Blue Blaze Coal Co. through a mining lease entered into on October 13, 1988 between Utah Coal and Chemical Corporation owner\lessee of record, a Nevada corporation (which includes sublease SL 063011), and William Roger Skaggs and Margaret A. Skaggs, assigned to Blue Blaze coal Company, a Utah Corporation.

The right to mine under the Federal Mineral Leasing Act of 1920 provides for multiple use of public lands.

The surface land owners were notified in writing on during the permit process and a public comments period was advertised in the local Sun Advocate and the Salt Lake Tribune for 4 consecutive weeks in April and May of 1991. See Enclosure IV for the letter and newspaper advertisement.

All coal mined from the Castlegate "A" Seam and the Hiawatha seam will be processed and loaded through the same loadout facility.

4. Recoverable coal reserves:

All coal that can economically and safely be recovered will be recovered. This has been demonstrated with the R2P2 and can be seen on the mining plans in the permit application filed with the State of Utah, Division of Oil, Gas and Minerals.

The only areas that will not be mined are barriers between the Blue Blaze Mines and the old worked out mine areas of previous mining. The worked out areas (pre-mining 1920 to 1950) are excluded from the tonnage figures.

5. Preliminary schedule:

The diligent development and continued operation will commence as soon as a permit is approved by the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining. The permit application is in its final stages and is expected to approved within the this year.

Period of mining of the Castlegate "A" Seam will be approved first according to the State of Utah, Division of Oil, Gas and Minerals. During the mining of the Castlegate "A" seam, drill holes will penetrate below the Hiawatha seam to evaluate the aquifers in the sandstone below the Hiawatha seam prior to commencement of mining the Hiawatha seam.

The tonnages that will be mined will be 360,000 tons per year. It will take 11.08 years to completely mine the 3,990,000 tons of recoverable coal.

The 11.08 year period is well under the 40 year mine out requirement of the Bureau of Land Management.

Dear Ms. Grubaugh-Littig:

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has reviewed the resource recovery and protection plan (R2P2) of the Permit Application Package for Blue Blaze Coal Company. Deficiencies were identified in the original plan which the company corrected through the submission of additional information directly to our office. This letter provides our comments and recommendations regarding the R2P2.

The original R2P2 and supplementary revisions are complete and technically adequate. However, the revised R2P2 shows projected mining development in the eastern portion of the permit area not considered in the original submission. Blue Blaze showed the first five years of mining, but not life of mine development. Revised mine plans show development projections into this area. Though mining in this area should have no different effect than other planned areas of mining, we feel you should be aware of the situation.

Before actual mining takes place, the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) of the Department of Labor must approve a roof-control and ventilation plan. This plan is an integral part of the R2P2 for coal recovery and is required by the BLM. As a condition of approval, Blue Blaze must submit copies of the ventilation and roof-control plans authorized by MSHA.

We have determined that the R2P2 is in compliance with the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, as amended, the regulatory provisions of 43 CFR 3480, Federal lease terms and conditions, and the requirement for achievement of maximum economic recovery (MER) of Federal coal. Therefore, we recommend approval of the R2P2 for this new mine on condition noted above.



COAL OWNERSHIP MAP






