A partial inspection of the Blazon Mine was conducted by Jean Doutre, Division of Oil, Gas & Mining Field Specialist, on June 9, 1982. The mining operation has been closed down since February 1, 1982 and some concerns mentioned in the May 4 inspection have been corrected.

1. Some trees and rock had fallen onto the access road. The trees have been cut through to allow vehicles to pass through up to the portal area.

2. The 12 inch culvert from the portal pad had been bent, so as to separate from the inlet. This has been joined properly at the top to carry water down the highwall so as to prevent erosion. The outlet end is still submerged and should be cleaned out.

3. The drainage ditch along the base of the highwall has been cleaned out to allow disturbed area runoff to flow down into the sediment pond.

No operations have begun. There is no storage room in the mine waste disposal area. A trip to the Clear Creek strip pit has been blocked by material being dumped at the old Clear Creek mine portal covering the roadway to three feet or more, denying access to anyone.
