Dear Mr. Darby,

To follow up our telephone conversation of February 7th, I have outlined below my understanding of requirements regarding water monitoring at the Blazon Number One mine. First, water monitoring results through December 23rd, 1981 should have been received by Sandy Pruitt by this time. Vaughn Hansen and Associates assured our office this would be sent to her attention by February 3, 1983.

Secondly, due to the shutdown of operations we would request a revised monitoring schedule that would consist of samples taken above and below the mine site at intervals to include spring, mid-summer and late summer. Water quality and quantity determinations would be made at these times and forwarded to your office. There is currently no discharge from the mine portal or the settlement ponds and repair work on all berms will be made as early in the spring as possible, weather and snow conditions considered.

If this will suffice and bring us to compliance with UMC 817.131 (a) please advise. If not we will wait for your additional requirements.
