

Subject: Blazon No. 1 Mine completed work items

Dear Mr. Braxton:

In accordance with the revised Reclamation As-Built Report for the Blazon No. 1 Mine dated May 10, 1989, the existing water well was capped on June 6, 1989 by Zimmerman Well Service, Inc., a Utah State licensed water well contractor. The cap was welded to the casing and the open notch in the casing which was used to accommodate the electrical wires for the pump was caulked with white silicon to obtain a water tight seal.

In accordance with the Small Area Exemption Field Amendment presented in the May 12, 1989 inspection report, 250 feet of silt fence was installed along each side of the Little Snider Canyon drainage on June 9, 1989 (a total of 500 feet). The downstream ends of the silt fence adjacent to the existing culvert inlet structure were flared away from the structure to prevent sediment from washing along the silt fence and exiting at the downstream end. In addition, all straw bales which were not being used for erosion control were removed from the mine site.

In accordance with the May 12, 1989 inspection report, five transects were established on June 12, 1989 to monitor the survival of the seedlings planted on May 15, 1989. This work was accomplished by Mr. Patrick Collins of Mt. Nebo Scientific. A summary report which includes the baseline data and methodology will be submitted at a later date.
