Notice is hereby given that Genwal Resources, Inc. P.O. Box 1420, Huntington, Utah 84528, a subsidiary owned jointly by Intermountain Power Agency and Andalex Resources, Inc. has submitted with the Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining, a complete application for revision to the existing Mine and Reclamation Plan, ACT/015/032. The existing plan is approved under the permanent program of the Utah Department of Natural Resources, Division of Oil, Gas and Mining. The expansion area will disturb an additional 4.70 acres on the following tracts of land:

- T.16 S., R.7 E., SLB&M UTAH
- Sec. 5, SW ¼ of NW ¼
- Sec. 5, NW ¼ of SW ¼

The proposed modification will consist of a new coal loading and stockpile area, truck turn around, and support facilities. Approximately 1200' of Upper Crandall Creek would be culverted for the life of this operation. The proposed expansion is located within 100 feet of the U.S. Forest Service (Public) road, and may cause some disruption of public access during the construction timeframe. Proposed surface disturbance is located on Genwal Fee Land. On August 9, 1996 Janette S. Kaiser, Forest Supervisor of the Manti-La Sal National Forest, decided to select Alternative 2 for implementation with the exception that the Hammond-Notch Canyon inventoried roadless area will not be entered for salvage under this decision. The 20 acre portion of the Hammond-Notch Canyon inventoried roadless area considered in the analysis will not be harvested at this time in conformance with July 2, 1996 direction of the Secretary of Agriculture for implementation of the Rescission Act.

The intent of the decision is to improve the long-term health of the forest across a portion of Elk Ridge on the Abajo Mountains, Moab/Monticello Ranger District, San Juan County, Utah. Some desired outcomes of the decision are to reduce bark beetle populations and subsequent mortality in ponderosa pine stands; reduce forest stand susceptibility to bark beetle attack; maintain or improve long-term conditions of forest age, stand production, and vegetative diversity; provide flexibility for future opportunities to manage for mature (old-growth like) and other desirable vegetative conditions; and provide salvage harvest opportunities for local and regional businesses.

The decision approves harvest of about 4.6 million board feet of dead dying, and at risk live timber across about 3,686 acres using ground base-

R. 643-877-132, and an Order of Nonconsensual Entry issued by the Utah Board of Oil, Gas and Mining ("Board") on January 24, 1996, the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining ("Division") hereby gives Notice of its intent to reclaim the abandoned Blazon Mine site near Clear Creek, Utah, Carbon County, more specifically located at the S/2 NW/4 and the N/2 SW/4 of Section 4, Township 14 South, Range 7 East, SLBM.

The division intends to do all things necessary or expedient to restore, reclaim, abate, control, or prevent the adverse effects of past coal mining, including, but not limited to, and subject to the available resources of the Division:

- a. Plugging of an abandoned water well;
- b. Removal of a degraded concrete building pad and other mine related disturbances located on the abandoned mine facilities pad area;
- c. Backfilling and grading the mine facilities pad area;
- d. Removing, backfilling and grading the sediment pond; and
- e. Removing two 72-inch culverts in Mud Creek and one 24-inch culvert in Little Snyder Drainage.
- f. These activities will be conducted over a period of time as site conditions and funding permit.

The Division intends to enter onto the Blazon mine site and commence reclamation activities 30 days after this Notice has been published pursuant to Utah Admin. R643-877-132.
