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

Dear Mr. Bradford:

Since receiving your letter of July 17, 1980, we met with ARCO Coal Company regarding the C.V. Spur and obtained a partial submission of a plan for the operation of the coal processing and loadout facility. On August 8 we received a copy of the application to your Bureau for the proposed extensions to the truck dump, coal storage and reclaim system. In view of the fact that the proposed facilities enhance pollution controls for the track dump and coal surge piles, we have no objection to their installation provided ARCO agrees to the following:

The operator of the C.V. Spur shall install, maintain, operate and report total suspended particulate data for a representative period at locations upwind and downwind of the coal surge pile. The type of data and length of record shall be agreed to by the regulatory authority. The data shall be used to indicate whether additional controls are required to protect environmental values.

We would require evidence of acceptance of this stipulation in order to find the proposed operation to be approvable.
