The Utah State Regulatory Program, approved January 21, 1981, required that all existing mines file an application for a permit within two months of the program approval date. All applications were to have been acted upon within eight months (September 21, 1981) of the program approval date; however, an administrative delay provision within the Utah Program allowed continued operations during extended permit application review.


It is now twenty months after the date by which all permits were to have been approved, and the Office of Surface Mining (OSM) is requiring that a decision be made on your permit. The Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (UDOGM) plans to make a decision on your permit application in November 1983. This decision will be made in accordance with the written findings of compliance requirements of UMC 786.19. These findings can be made only on the basis of a complete application, and cannot be addressed through the use of permit stipulations. Therefore, it is essential that you respond to any deficiencies found during the review of your application within the time period stated in the deficiency letter.

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UDOGM will retain the lead agency role in reviewing your application for a permit since your operation does not involve Federal lands in Utah. Once the regulatory authority has made a decision on your permit application, your authorization to continue operation under administrative delay is ended. This means that in order to approve your permit application, we must have the information necessary to make all of the required findings on schedule.
