A partial inspection was conducted at the above mentioned mine site on August 14, 1984 by Barton Kale of the Division. The inspector was accompanied by Dan Guy of Beaver Creek Coal Company.

At this time the site was dry. The sediment ponds were empty with the exception of the large pond on the east side (south of the rail loadout). No problems were noted as the plant is still not operating, although the area is still used as a loadout and refuse site.

The water level in the above mentioned pond has risen during the summer months while the other ponds have remained dry. It is the inspectors opinion that there is a possible inflow of water to that pond but as of yet no evidence has been observed. The fields beyond the perimeter are irrigated and have caused problems in the past concerning irrigation pipes leading into Beaver Creeks property. This pond will continue to be monitored during inspections.
