GENERAL COMMENTS:

Pam Grubaugh-Littig (DOGM) accompanied the undersigned on this partial inspection; BCC Company officials were unable to partake in this inspection, however, the findings were relayed to Dick Wilson (field), Burk Biersdorf (BCCC office at C.V. Spur), and Jay Marshal (BCCC main office.)

3. TOPSOIL:

The topsoil storage areas were observed and found in a stable condition, but the vegetative growth appears minimal and may require further enhancement in the near future. However, the vegetative success rate at this particular site is indicative of the overall general area.

4b. DIVERSIONS

A follow-up on the maintenance issues described in the previous inspection report (10/3/88) was conducted. All of the items addressed were completed with the exception of the inlet area to culvert C8; additional rip-rap is required on the embankment and should be supplied within the next couple of days.

The 12" culvert below Jensen Trucking boundary needed repair as the inlet had been crushed during previous cleaning efforts. Mr. Wilson repaired the inlet area before the inspection was completed. Also, the outlet had been ripped and it was suggested to Mr. Wilson and Mr. Biersdorf that the pipe should be cut off at the damaged point. Although the outlet damage is readily apparent, it does not effect the functionalability of the system and will be repaired accordingly.

16. ROAD MAINTENANCE:

A considerable amount of dust was being generated by the coal trucks and equipment on the property prior to the inspection. However, the water truck was seen on the road adjacent to the truck dump and the dust problem was quickly alleviated.
