Synopsis

On July 19, 1988, the Division requested that the test plot write-up (C.V. Spur PAP, Appendix 9-1) be modified to describe what was actually done, and show the as-built configuration.

Analysis

Beaver Creek Coal Company (BCCC) provided figures, showing the as-built test plot and strip planting configurations. Also provided were laboratory analyses of two test plot samples taken.

Recommendations

Beaver Creek Coal Company must still revise the methodology section in Appendix 9-1 to describe the as-built treatments, amendments (fertilizer, mulch and tackifier), and planting and mulching techniques. Attachment 1 must be revised to show plant species and varieties used in test plot treatments. The names of plant species identified for use in strip plantings should be spelled correctly. The submission should be paginated and completely replace all old materials in Appendix 9-1.
