RE: Redesignation of Primary Roads, Andalex Resources, Inc., Wildcat Loadout, ACT/007/033-90C, Folder #3, Carbon County, Utah

Synopsis

On October 1, 1990, the Division received from Andalex Resources, Inc. a packet of Mine Plan text additions and maps which sets forth the company's redesignation of its roads in accordance with the new regulations. This memorandum constitutes a review of these road redesignations.

Analysis

The operator has divided the entire road network into 10 roads. All roads are designated as primary roads and are referred to in the text and on the applicable maps as "PR-1", "PR-2", and so on. The roads, with their individual lengths, widths, grades, surface materials, and normal usages are described on pages 152 through 155-A of the packet. In addition, the roads are clearly shown on Plate I (Surface Facilities) and typical cross sections are shown on Plates 17 and 17A.

Recommendations

The operator has done an excellent job of redesignating the roads and presenting, explaining, and describing the redesignations. It is recommended that the text and maps in question be inserted into the mine plan.

Though the roads have been redesignated in accordance with the new R614 rules, the text and maps of the packet still refer to the old UMC rules. This need not be changed at present. However, the operator should be aware that the entire mine plan will have to be updated and all references to the old rules removed during the next 5-year permit renewal, which will be coming toward the end of 1991.
