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

Dear Mr. Braxton:

I have received and reviewed your response to the above-referenced Ten-Day Notice (TDN).

In your response to part 1 of the TDN, you indicate that submittals were received within the 10-day period which address the violation cited in part 1 and that review of these submittals should be completed on or about April 25, 1994. I find your response to part 1 to be good cause not to pursue further enforcement at this time.

In regard to parts 2, 3 and 4 of the TDN, you have provided a copy of a Notice of Violation which addresses the violations stated in parts 2, 3 and 4 of the TDN; therefore, I find your response to parts 2, 3 and 4 to constitute appropriate action.

Resolution of all violations listed in the TDN is subject to oversight activity; therefore, the Albuquerque Field Office shall monitor implementation of the actions which formed the basis for the written finding discussed above.
