### 7. COAL MINE WASTE/REFUSE PILES/IMPOUNDMENTS

The entire "bonny" pile on the west side of the rail road tracks had been used as fill in the expansion project.

### 8. NONCOAL WASTE

Noncoal waste was observed littered through out the site, presumably from the construction activities. This waste must be disposed of properly.

### 9. PROTECTION OF FISH, WILDLIFE AND RELATED VALUES

The Wyoming Big Sagebrush on site had been heavily browsed by deer.

### 13. REVEGETATION

The leach field was seeded the day of this inspection. The operator ripped the surface as seedbed preparation. This method provided good surface roughness. The operator was also in the process of preparing the new coal pile expansion road and pad out slopes for seeding. The expansion project is due for completion mid-March.

Mike Glasson was reminded of the permit commitment to begin irrigation on the test plots in early April.
