Construction Permit

Dear Mr. Allen:

We have reviewed the revised plans and supporting documents for the construction of the referenced facility. The revised permit application was submitted to us on September 21, 1988. The original permit application was submitted in February, 1988.

The plans and specifications, as submitted, comply with the Utah Wastewater Disposal Regulations. A construction permit, as constituted by this letter, is issued subject to the following conditions:

1. Any modification to the approved plans and specifications must be reviewed and approved prior to construction.
2. Facilities constructed under this permit must not be placed in service until the Bureau of Water Pollution Control has completed a final inspection, and has authorized you to do so.

The issuance of this permit does not relieve you in any way of obtaining applicable permits from local jurisdictions. You may contact Claron Bjork of the Southeast Utah District Health Department at (801) 637-3671 for compliance with any other local requirements. Compliance with your discharge permit must be maintained during construction of the approved project.

If the approved project is not under construction within one year, then it will become necessary to resubmit the plans and specifications for reissuance of the construction permit.

The basic project consists construction of a sediment pond with a total storage capacity of 1.45 acre feet. Primary, dewatering, and emergency spillways will be provided. The sediment pond will serve a coal preparation, storage and loading facility.


Please provide us with two sets of plans and supporting documents for the sediment pond. A set of approved plans and supporting documents bearing our construction permit stamp will be returned. This set of plans must be kept available for examination during inspections conducted by representatives of the Bureau of Water Pollution Control, and for resolution of any conflicts or discrepancies in construction that may arise.

Please advise us of the beginning of construction. This will enable us to schedule periodic inspections and monitor progress.
