The referenced amendment has been reviewed by Senior Reclamation Specialist Steve Demczak. His analysis is provided for your review and response.

TECHNICAL ANALYSIS:

BONDING AND INSURANCE

Regulatory Reference: R645-301-812.700

The development material could be stored at the Banning Loadout for an undetermined amount of time before being moved permanently to the Dugout permanent refuse pile. The Dugout permanent refuse pile amendment has not been approved nor submitted to the Division. If forfeiture takes place, the Division would either move the development waste to a permitted site or reclaim the material on site. The reclamation cost estimate for the Banning facility does not include the waste rock material.

The R645 Coal Rules do not address bonding from one permit to another. Bonding is to stand alone for each permit.
