RE: Canyon Fuel Company, LLC. - "Banning Loadout" - Application for a Permit Renewal

Dear Mr. Haddock:

This in response to the Utah Division of Oil, Gas, & Mining's (UT-DOG M) June 19, 2003, request for a decision, under 30 CFR 944.30, whether the above subject permit renewal constitutes a mining plan modification.

Mining plan approvals by the Secretary of the Interior are required under the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, 30 U.S.C 181, *et seq.* before coal mining can occur on Federal lands. This letter serves to document OSM's determination whether or not a mining plan approval from the Secretary is required for the above permitting action.

OSM's review of the Application for a Permit Renewal has determined that it proposes to continue surface mining and reclamation operations at the Banning Loadout, Utah State permit C/007/034 for a period of five additional years. No other revisions to the existing permit have been included with the renewal application.

Based on a review of the activities associated with the permit revision, OSM has determined that the proposal is administrative in nature and does not meet the requirements of 30 CFR ' 746.11(a) and 746.18(d). Therefore, since no changes in the recovery of Federal coal is involved, the proposed permit revision does not constitute a mining plan action requiring Secretarial approval.

Please notify the applicant of our decision on this matter.

OSM's decision does not, however, relieve UT-DOG M from coordinating the review and approval of the Application for a Permit Renewal with other Federal agencies for compliance with other Federal regulations.
