Dear Randy,

This letter is in regards to Violation No. N93-40-6-4, 4 of 4. The violation was issued, "For transporting and stockpiling of coal and/or coal refuse to the Coarse Refuse Pile (from an unpermitted site) in a manner that is not approved under the current PAP." The violation applies to the haul road from the permit boundary (adjacent to the cogen plant) to the Coarse Refuse Pile and the areas of the Coarse Refuse Pile and West Slurry Cell where reject coal and/or coal refuse from the cogen facility has been placed.

In order to satisfy the requirements of this violation, SCA is required to immediately cease transporting and stockpiling the material as noted above. All material that was improperly transported and stockpiled must be removed from the areas noted above and moved back to the cogen facility. This action must be completed by October 15, 1993.

SCA has contracted Savage Construction to supply the cogeneration facility with the coarse refuse from the SCA Permit Area. In order to satisfy the requirements of this violation, Savage has provided an outline describing their future operations in relation to the placement of the coal refuse. This plan includes the following measures:

1. The high ash fuel rejects which were hauled back to the fuel site were, and will continue to be backblended into higher quality fuel and returned to the plant for consumption.
2. Material that was placed along roadways will be picked up, removed and used as backblending material as per item #1.
3. The crushing/screening process has been modified to eliminate the rejects stream and no further material will be hauled back to the fuel site.

Basically, Savage has stated that the material that was improperly stockpiled will no longer be created and the existing material will be backblended with the coarse refuse on site and utilized in the cogeneration facility.
