

2.1.2.2 Ownership and Control

Exhibit 1, Ownership Information, provides the name, business address, telephone number, and employer identification number of Plateau Mining Corporation and lists the officers and directors along with their title (officers only), social security number, and the date that they assumed or resigned the designated position of responsibility.

2.1.2.3 Other Coal Mining Operations Under Common Ownership or Control

Corporate entities identified in Section 2.1.2.1, Applicant Information, have ownership or control relationships to a number of other coal mining and reclamation operations in the United States. Given the number of coal operations which fall under this category, listings of all operations under common ownership or control during the past 5 years are provided in Exhibit 1, Ownership Information.
