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Bonding with zeroed sheets

Vicky,

As we discussed earlier today about the issue of zeroing the old sheets where the equipment has been moved and re-bonded for in a new area.

After talking with Daron, he agrees with my concerns about completely zeroing the sheets for the sites. Equipment and/or building demolition wise, the fact that the stated items were moved and re-bonded for in other sheets should be fine with just note explaining in the appropriate Demo sheet.

The problem is any earthwork that was or could have done at either or both sites still needs to be accounted for., i.e. was the old site regraded for a pad and restored to AOC? The only way we have to verify that the site was reclaimed to regulation standards, which protect the state and the permittee from third party concerns post mining, is the Phase I, II and III bond release for the areas.

Because the sites have been disturbed, the old disturbance footprint will need to be accounted for in the earthwork sheets. I'm not sure where the stated sites where and what sheet would be the appropriate site that would include those specific site's information (i.e Mine facility cut/fill sub earthwork sheet or some other earthwork sheet that might have been removed.) Your assistance in tracking down this information would be greatly appreciated.

As for the historically old sheets pulley racks and shelves, due to the length of time since their removal and the relatively small area that would have been affected, the sheets quantity column will be corrected from zero to simply reflect the information present in the columns G-R with the information that is still present in them.

If you have any questions, please feel free to call me. I expect to have the page by page review of the MRP sheets completed by next week and will let you know all the sheets that need to be updated within the MRP to reflect the correct Appendix 5-9 version you supplied.

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
