Indian Ricegrass (Oryzopsis hymenoides)	1
Russian Wildrye (Elymus junceus)	2
Sand Dropseed (Sporobolus cryptandrus)	1
Winterfat (Eurotia lanata)	1
Fourwing Saltbush (Atriplex canescens)	2
Rubber Rabbitbrush (Chrysothamnus nauseosus)	2
Yellow Sweetclover (Melilotus officinalis)	1
TOTAL	16 lbs./acre

Vegetation existing in the area to be mined is representative of the Shadscale Saltbush type and consists of:

- Fourwing Saltbush,
- Big Sagebrush,
- Black Greasewood,
- Shadscale,
- Indian Ricegrass,
- Blue Gramma Grass,
- Sand Dropseed,
- and various annuals.
