

Dear Mr. Tetting:

Northwest Carbon Corporation has purchased the seed for reclaiming the drill pads and appropriate markers for the drill holes, as prescribed by Mr. Gordon Whitney of USGS. On October 14, 1981, I met on site with our contractor to discuss the reclamation and markers. At that time, there was up to 16 inches of snow on the drill pads.

We visited the U. S. Forest Service office in Price and discussed the reclamation project with Mr. Ira Hatch. Mr. Hatch suggested two alternatives; seed on top of the snow, or seed the drill pads in the spring. Mr. Hatch and his staff indicated that in all likelihood, the drill pads would not dry sufficiently to properly seed until spring.

Northwest Carbon plans to initiate seeding on the drill pads in late May or early June depending upon the weather and ground conditions. At that time, all drill holes will be marked with the tags Northwest Carbon has purchased.

Exploration on our Utah properties has ceased as of June of 1981. At this time, Northwest Carbon does not plan any additional exploration.
