The Utah Preservation Office has received for consideration your letter of December 19, 1983, forwarding a copy of the response to review by Western States Minerals for their J. B. King Mine in Emery County, Utah. After review of the material, our office has the following comments for consideration by the Division of Oil, Gas & Mining:


1. The report appears to have professionally located known sites in the project area, and made recommendations concerning the eligibility of those sites.
2. On page 29 of the report, the information advising the mining company of whom to consult for eligibility of the sites is wrong. It mentions the Antiquities Section with the Division of State History. A formal determination of eligibility is sought from the Keeper of the National Register. However, before this is done, consultation should take place with the Division of Oil, Gas & Mining and the Office of Surface Mining. The federal agency is responsible for directing consultation then to the Division of State History in the State Historic Preservation Office. That is outlined clearly in 36 CFR 800.
3. The bibliography cited the people who filled out the site forms on related surveys in the project area, but did not cite the reports that those forms were associated with.
