Dear Mr. Holligan:

This letter is in response to your September 2, 1980 letter requesting extension of the December 31, 1980 due date for the Huntington Canyon No. 4 Mine Wildlife Habitat survey.

Shirley Lindsay of my staff has been in contact with MaryAnn Wright of the Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining, and they have agreed to the following compromise: both the raptor study and the threatened and endangered species survey will be submitted by December 31, 1980. This submission will include analysis of impacts, if any, to raptors or threatened and endangered species as well as proposed mitigation measures for protection of any such species identified on the site. The remainder of the data required by Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining, as shown on the Wildlife Guidelines attached to your September 2 letter, will be submitted by September, 1981.

We understand that there have been certain delays in connection with the wildlife data gathering that were beyond your control. We trust this partial extension of time will assist you to complete this requirement in a timely and thorough manner.
