The Division is currently seeking OSM's approval for Phase II bond release for this site. A Forest Service comment included concurrence with the release provided sufficient monies were retained for pond removal. The road into Mill D Canyon was covered with zero to a foot of snow. Vehicles had accessed the Forest Service road approximately 1 1/2 miles. This inspector accessed the site on cross country skis. The upper road was walked and mostly devoid of snow. The lower site was also mostly clear of snow except in the bottom of the ponds and the lowest part of the site. No noticeable runoff had occurred, most snow was adsorbed.

2. SIGNS AND MARKERS

The permit signs were in place and contained the correct information.

9. PROTECTION OF FISH, WILDLIFE AND RELATED ENVIRONMENTAL VALUES

Elk usage along the upper road had been extremely heavy this year. A pellet group was encountered almost every 10 feet. The smell of elk along the entire road was very strong. It is this inspectors opinion that the vegetation will recover with no adverse effects provided the elk do not stay all spring. Spring growth should be monitored in order to measure vegetation at it's peak for the final Phase III bond release sampling.
