SUBJECT: Recognition of David Mills as a P.E.

DATE: March 22, 1979

The final regulations of the Office of Surface Mining defer to State law for the definition of professional registered engineer. Section 58-22-1 et. seq., U.C.A., 1953, as amended governs the certification of engineers in the state. These provisions are administered by the Department of Registration of Business Regulation. Section 58-22-21(c) U.C.A. allows a professional engineer to practice for 60 days pending the approval of a pending application for a certificate of registration. In contacting the Department of Registration I have found that although Mr. Mills has submitted an application, he has failed to demonstrate any verification of his profession engineer status in the State of Pennsylvania. Until this verification is provided, Mr. Mills does not meet the requirements of U.C.A. 58-22-21(c) and cannot practice his profession in this State.
