Dear Mr. Childs:

This letter is a follow up to our meeting held between Scott Nordness and yourself representing Natomas and Tom Munson and myself of the Division. The meeting, conducted at the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining's offices on Tuesday March 8, 1983 was held to discuss abatement plans submitted on this day for the abatement of NOV N82-7-7-1.

The NOV was issued December 9, 1982 and allowed one week for the development and submittal of complete and adequate plans to address this hydrologic problem. An on-site meeting was held December 21, 1982 at which time Tom Munson and myself discussed abatement plans and an extension was granted until February 12, 1983 for the submittal of these plans. Plans were received but were deemed inadequate for abatement. Again, the abatement time was extended 30 days until March 9, 1983. This extension moved the abatement date up to the 90th day and is a final extension.

Administrative delay is hereby initiated to allow time for review of the plans submitted today. Should DOGM hydrologists require additional information, this delay leaves a one day response period for Natomas Trail Mountain Coal Company before the 90th day and consequently a failure to abate situation. This should be avoided if at all possible.
