Beaver Creek Coal Company submitted a plan to install a portable screening plant at the Trail Mountain #9 Mine on a temporary basis. The portable screening plant would be located in the existing loadout stockpile area; therefore, no additional drainage controls will be necessary.

The plant is temporary in nature, but the length of time it will be on-site was not stated. The plant is portable and only the cost of pulling the plant off-site would need to be added, a minimal cost now covered in the escalation factor of the bond (posted in 1989 dollars).

I have sent an inquiry to Dave Kopta, Compliance, Bureau of Air Quality, regarding Beaver Creek Coal Company's statement that no air quality permit is required on March 14, 1988. A reply is forthcoming.

This amendment should be approved, but the duration of the "temporary" nature should be clarified.
