On January 9, 1991, I corresponded with you concerning matters relevant to the Trail Mountain Mine. In my letter, I indicated that the Company did not own enough water to provide for their projected needs. In reviewing this matter further, it has come to my attention that there was an error in our previous figures. This letter is written to correct this matter. It is anticipated that Beaver Creek will use 7.87 acre feet of water annually. Under their existing Exchange Application #2402 (93-Area), they have the right to use up to 17.6 acre feet per year. As you can see, they are well within their water right limit. Therefore, it will not be necessary for them to acquire any additional water rights.
