Regulatory Reference: 30 CFR 783.12; R645-301-411.

The application includes a cultural resource inventory for the three proposed drilling locations, Appendix B. Montgomery Archeological Consultants under the guise of Montgomery and Stash conducted the survey in June of 2006. According to the survey results no cultural resources were identified and a finding of "no historic properties affected" was recommended.
