On April 13, 1983 DOGM Field Specialist Ken Wyatt conducted a partial inspection at the Des Bee Dove Mines. Bob Oviatt and Val Payne accompanied this inspector during the field tour. The weather was cloudy and cold approximately 35° F with one inch of recent snowfall. The purpose of this inspection was to refamiliarize this inspector with the mine area.

At the time of this inspection the Beehive-Deseret pad was muddy, drainages were adequate into the Beehive Mine. These areas are continually being maintained to promote drainage from the pad into the portals. Drainages throughout the mine area appeared to be adequately maintained at this time

Additional straw bales have been installed at the hairpin turn below the main mine access road. The new haul road connecting with the Wilberg haul road was used to access the sediment pond. No problems were observed in this area, however a small trickle was observed flowing from the discharge pipe. The quality of this water appeared very good, the quantity was minimal. No compliance problems were observed at this time.
