A telephone conversation was held with Mr. Larry Guymon on August 22, 1984 discussing the Des-Bee-Dove sediment storage plan and the applicability of the regulations under UMC 817.46, Hydrologic Balance: Sedimentation Ponds, mentioned in a letter to you on July 23, 1984. It was stated in this letter that sections (k) through (m) and (q) through (u) must be addressed in the permitting process.

After determining the applicability of the sediment pond regulations to the permitting of this structure, Mr. Guymon and the Division decided that stability of the embankment, drainage control around and on the structure, the character of the slurry itself and reclamation and revegetation were the most important issues to address through the permitting process. Mr. Guymon stated that he is carrying out the emergency stabilization procedures, as well as a stability analysis of the embankment and a drilling program to characterize the nature of the slurry impounded. Mr. Guymon was requested to submit a letter to the Division giving exact time frames associated with any extension of the original 30 day time frame to address permitting requirements and carry out these tasks.
