RE: TERMINATION OF MANDATORY INSPECTION OF DES BEE DOVE JUNCTION ROAD

Dear Ms. Grubaugh-Littig:

Since September 1985, UP&L Mining Division and formerly Emery Mining have complied with an inspection program set up as abatement to past violations and concerns following the construction of the road project. Compliance with the program required the inspection of drainage controls and conveyance structures, including 4 monitoring sites, during the months of May, July and September.

The road is now having less concerns in these areas and we feel that the mandatory program is no longer necessary for continued compliance. Routine inspections by the Mining Division of the road will continue to be conducted by Mining Division personnel and any concerns will be addressed.

The Mining Division will continue to monitor the 4 sites at the fill slope area as part of the Reclaimability Study.

The above recommendations have been discussed with DOGM Hydrologist, Tom Munson. He also sees no value in continuing the inspection program and supports our proposal.
