1. PERMITS, CHANGE, TRANSFER, RENEWAL, SALE

The permit was issued September 7, 1995 and will expire August 30, 2000. The Operator has initiated the renewal process. One stipulation was attached to the 1995 permit. The stipulation concerned the federal cessation order which now, has been resolved and closed. A Division letter dated June 15, 1998 noted that the condition had been met.

2. SIGNS AND MARKERS

Disturbed area markers are the only method to determine the disturbed area. Many of the markers are missing. No map is found in the permit clearly showing the disturbed area

4. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE

a. Diversions

The diversion along the road requires rock removal. The diversion on the lower pad by the tipple may need check dams to prevent down-cutting. The cement culvert inlet box on the tipple pad needs large debris cleaned from the trash rack.

b. Sediment Ponds and Impoundments

The quarterly pond inspection was conducted by John Christensen and Richard Cullum on March 13, 2000. The Operator uses the quarterly inspection for the annual inspection since each inspection is certified by a professional engineer. The pond, as always, contained water on this inspection.

e. Effluent Limitations

UPDES Permit # UTG040022 discharge point 001A is assigned to the Mine Site Pond. First quarter DMR reports were observed in the Operators's office and no discharge was reported.

7. COAL MINE WASTE

Coal mine waste and noncoal waste have been placed against cut slopes and highwalls. Asphalt was included in the material place against the material yard cut slope. The Forest Service stated in the May 11, 2000 during anⁱⁿ site meeting that Forest land is not suitable for solid waste disposal. The Operator stated that no decision has been made on what to do with this material.

8. NONCOAL WASTE

Noncoal waste was scattered throughout the site from demolition activities. This material must be placed as required by the permit. In particular are the items both within and outside the disturbed area at the base of the bath house slope. (see Figure 1 above)

12. BACKFILLING AND GRADING

Two remote fan portals will be reclaimed by the Operator in July. One of these portals is within a half mile radius of an active golden eagle nest. The Operator is complying with restriction dates suggested by the DWR.

21. BONDING & INSURANCE

Bond No. 400JN6139 is held by St. Paul Fire and Marine Insurance Company in the amount of \$1,837,712.

Associated Electric & Gas Insurance Services Limit provides general liability insurance. The policy is effective until 8/01/00.
