Subject: more on lone peak

Dennis,
I forgot one other fact to provide Lone Peak - elevation.

I talked with Paul B and he agrees with me 100%. So, at least you have our input for recommending planting in the fall, especially for your site.

Also, we would like you to stick with the original four bare root species.

- All four species are found in the P/J vegetation community type for the Des Bee site (Jerry Barker 1982).
- I also calculated the approximate amount of pinyons for the project is around 1300 (that's if you divide the total by 4 species). In the overall picture, it doesn't seem significant enough to warrant a change from the original list.

I also wondered if the Rocky Mount Juniper is what you really want. You may want to ask lone peak if Utah Juniper is better. Your veg survey (1982) shows Utah J at the site not RM. I'm just wondering if the RM Juniper was a mistake that happened along the permitting process???

Last comment, the W Big Sage prefers a min of 10" of ppt (not 6-8"). Furthermore, this species is found at higher elevations than Des Bee (veg survey 1982).
