Dear Mr. Feight:

These mining operations of the Utah Power & Light Company are all ongoing operations and basic disturbance of wildlife habitats and wildlife resources have already transpired. We do believe that the mine plan should include a vegetation map of the mine plan areas showing vegetational communities, species composition of those communities and occurrence of all natural water sources. We do not believe that any necessity exists for initiating new studies to increase the biological baseline available for preparation of the mine plan. This refers only to the existing ongoing operations. If expansion of operations or disturbances of new areas are contemplated, then these areas must be surveyed.

To the best of our knowledge, no endangered or threatened plant species or critical habitat for threatened or endangered wildlife species occur in the disturbed areas of the subject mining operations.

The foregoing comments are applicable with one exception; the disturbances that occurred at the Cottonwood portal are recent. An examination of the area around the portal for nesting raptors should be initiated. Any further development activity occurring in the area could detrimentally affect any nesting raptors that maybe adjacent to the facilities.


