INTRODUCTION:



INTRODUCTION:

The permitted site at the mine was complete during 4th quarter 1987. A plan has been submitted on March 7, 1988, to use this material for backfill to upgrade an existing storage pad in Elk Canyon. Pending approval of the plan the material is beginning stockpiled in Elk Canyon for this use. This plan will use approximately 24,500 yards of material. This should take roughly 7 months to completed this fill structure.

A waste rock storage plan was submitted to DOGM on April 13th. This plan, once approved, will handle the life of mine need for waste rock disposal.
