
Dear Ms. Grubaugh-Littig:

Attached is the revised hydrologic section for the Deer Creek, Cottonwood, and Des-Bee-Dove permits (ACT/015/018, ACT/015/019, ACT/015/017, respectively). As we discussed on the phone, Pacificorp will submit two copies for your review. If you think the two Division orders and the concerns raised by the Forest Service have been adequately addressed, Pacificorp will then submit an additional twelve copies of the hydrologic section.

Currently, we are testing samples monthly from the discharge recession springs for modified operational parameters (calcium, hardness, magnesium, and manganese). This sampling along with the July and October operational monitoring has shown no variation on a seasonal basis (please review annual Hydrologic Monitoring reports); therefore, the East Mountain Spring sampling schedule has been updated to reflect monitoring of the springs for field parameters only, except in July and October when operational parameters will be tested. Also note that the hydrologic monitoring locations and schedule have been revised to reflect monitoring of Deer Creek-Huntington Creek associated with the temporary Deer Creek Mine Discharge Permit.
