**NOTICE OF HEARING DOCKET NO. 99-004 CAUSE NO. 243-1
BEFORE THE BOARD OF OIL, GAS AND MINING DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, STATE OF UTAH**

MATTER OF THE REQUEST FOR AGENCY ACTION OF RIVER GAS CORPORATION FOR AN ORDER SUSPENDING APPLICATION OF THE BOARD'S ORDERS ENJOINED IN CAUSE NOS. 137-2(B) AND 243-1 AND UTAH ADMIN. CODE RULE R649-3-2 AS THEY PERTAIN TO LANDS WITHIN THE DRUNKARDS WASH FEDERAL EXPLORATORY UNIT, COVERING PORTIONS OF TOWNSHIPS 14, 15 AND 16 SOUTH, RANGES 8, 9 AND 10 EAST, SLM, CARBON AND EMERY COUNTIES, UTAH.

Notice of the proceeding will be for the Board to receive testimony and evidence regarding the application of Utah Admin. Code Rule R649-3-2 and declaring that the Board's Cause No. 137-2(B) and Cause No. 243-1 are inapplicable insofar as they pertain to the Unit Area located in portions of Townships 14, 15 and 16 South, Ranges 8, 9 and 10 East, Carbon and Emery Counties, Utah, until such time as said lands are eliminated from the Drunkards Wash Federal Exploratory Unit by contraction or termination.

Notice that all wells currently located within the Unit Area are exempt from application of the Board's orders entered in Cause Nos. 137-2(B) and 243-1 and Utah Admin. Code Rule R649-3-2 until their existence and prior Division of Oil, Gas and Mining approval.

Notice that no future well may be located closer than 460 feet to the boundaries of the Unit Area without administrative approval of the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining in accordance with Utah Admin. Code Rule R649-3-3.

Notice for such other and further relief as may be just and equitable under the circumstances.

MATTER OF THE REQUEST FOR AGENCY ACTION OF TEXACO EXPLORATION AND PRODUCTION INC. FOR AN ORDER ESTABLISHING 160 ACRE (OR SUBSTANTIAL EQUIVALENT THEREOF) DRILLING AND SPACING UNITS FOR THE PRODUCTION OF GAS (INCLUDING COALBED METHANE) FROM THE FERRON FORMATION, PORTIONS OF TOWNSHIPS 17 AND 18 SOUTH, RANGE 7 EAST, SLM, EMERY COUNTY, UTAH.

The Forest Service is evaluating a permit amendment submitted to the Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining by PacifiCorp. The proposed amendment would allow PacifiCorp to transport solid bulk materials via tractor/trailer to Deer Creek Mine workings along the county road in the main fork of Rilda Canyon to the existing breakout access road in the Left Fork of Rilda Canyon. Materials would be unloaded at the existing Left Fork Breakout and transported to the mine workings via underground mine vehicles. The amendment would allow PacifiCorp to minimize more costly transport of materials through underground mine workings from their mine in Deer Creek. Use of the breakout access road is currently limited to emergency use to minimize truck traffic along the Huntington Canyon Scenic Byway and disturbance to wildlife and recreation use in Rilda Canyon. PacifiCorp has proposed to haul materials between April 15 to December 1. Hauling would average 5.4 trucks per day. No hauling would take place on weekends, holidays, or the day preceding the opening of the regular season deer and elk hunts. The South Fork Breakout is located in Section 29, T. 16 S., R. 7 E. SLM, Emery County, Utah.

If no extraordinary circumstances or significant effects are identified through scoping/analysis, the Forest Service anticipates documenting the environmental analysis in a Decision Memo because it would qualify for categorical exclusion from documentation in an Environmental Assessment or Environmental Impact Statement (FSH 1909.15, Section 31.2).

The Forest Service is inviting public input through the scoping process.
